## Scott Craven (1948 - )

Scott Craven is an ambassador for Wisconsin's wildlife, with a gift of sharing his knowledge and enthusiasm for Wisconsin's natural resources. As a popular and talented UW- Madison Wildlife Professor and UW-Extension Specialist, he reached thousands through his lectures, presentations, publications, 4-H efforts, and radio programs on wildlife, natural resources, and the land ethic.

Scott also provided leadership

and service to hundreds of conservation agencies and organizations. His outreach initiatives in Wildlife Damage Management helped the public deal thoughtfully with wildlife problems, and his Wildlife Coverts Project taught private landowners how to protect and create wildlife habitat. He received numerous awards from organizations, agencies, and universities for his many contributions to conservation.

# **Don L. Johnson** (1927 - 2006)

For over 40 years, Don L. Johnson was one of Wisconsin's best-known outdoor writers and columnists. He wrote extensively about hunting and fishing in Wisconsin, first for the Eau Claire Leader and Telegram and then for the Milwaukee Sentinel. As a pioneer in environmental journalism, he also tackled complex public policy issues and advanced meaningful

changes to conservation advocacy and government regulatory policy.

He published widely as a freelance writer in outdoor magazines and published his short nature essays in Summer's Song & Other Essays. As an avid outdoorsman, he taught the public about outdoor-related activities through his writings, workshops, and clinics. For his service and exemplary writing, he received many honors from conservation, environmental and outdoor organizations.

# **Aroline Schmitt** (1904 - 1995)



Aroline Schmitt was a pioneering woman and citizen conservationist, who worked in a man's world during the 1930-1960s. She advanced sustainable forestry and promoted fledgling conservation organizations and initiatives in Wisconsin and the nation. She helped organize and led the Citizens Natural Resources Association and the Wisconsin Garden Club Federation.

Photo Credit: Maxine Schmitt Roberts As a persuasive speaker and writer, she advocated for strong conservation policies and played a pivotal role in protecting the Flambeau State Forest, the Menominee Tribal Forest, and the creation of Trees for Tomorrow and the Northern Forest Research Center. She received awards and recognition for her knowledge, tenacity and dedication. Despite health challenges for much of her life, she fought with determination and charisma to advance major conservation policies affecting Wisconsin's natural heritage.


### Induction Nominations are Invited

The Wisconsin Conservation Hall of Fame Foundation recognizes individuals who have contributed significantly to the growth of the conservation ideal in Wisconsin and the Nation.

Persons may be nominated for induction by member organizations, their representatives or by the public. Induction criteria requires that the candidate has significant ties to Wisconsin. The person should have made a sustained and outstanding contribution to conservation in at least one of several areas, including applied resource management, resource policy and law, and conservation education, literature, art or journalism.

Ideally, the candidate will have affected a wide range of natural resources of statewide, regional, or national significance. The candidate's achievements are compared to past inductee contributions and are evaluated in the context of the historical setting of their time.

The Wisconsin Conservation Hall of Fame is located at Schmeeckle Reserve in Stevens Point, WI. It was established in 1985 to advance the conservation legacy of Wisconsin and now recognizes nearly one hundred leaders who have contributed to it.

Individuals may be nominated for induction by member organizations or by the public. Based on a set of criteria, nominees are selected for induction by the WCHF Board of Directors and an independent Board of Governors.

- a sunlit gallery displaying recognition plaques of the inductees,
- a meeting/classroom used by hundreds of civic organizations each year,
