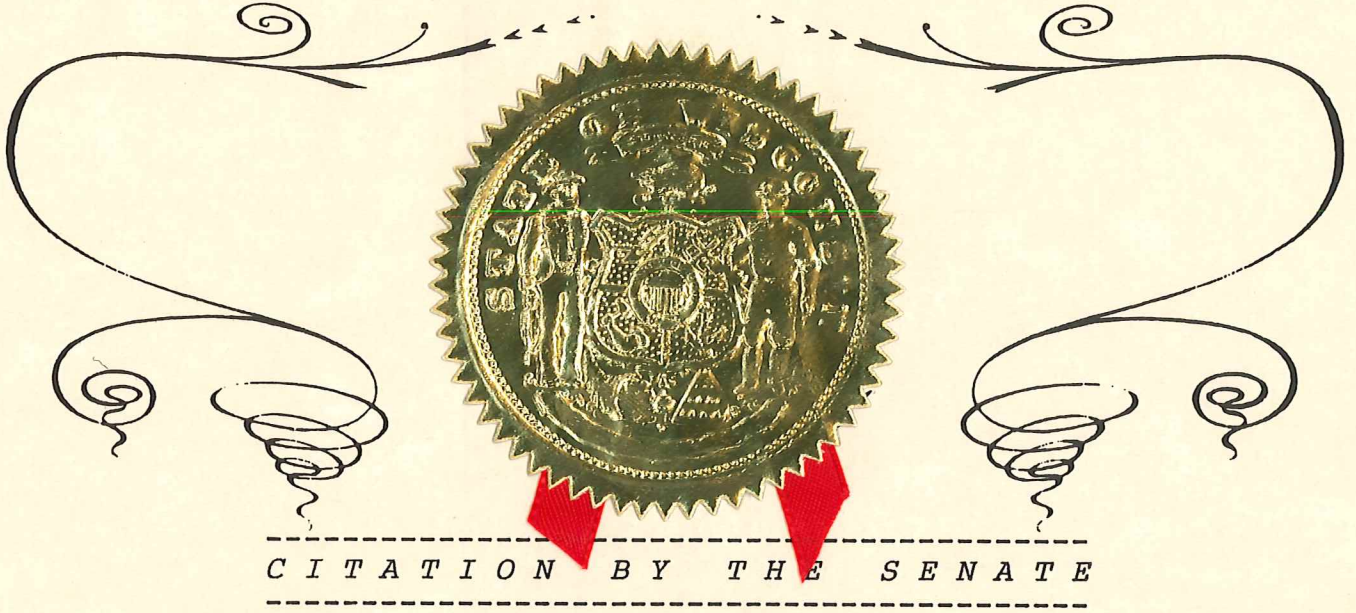

## KNOW YOU BY THESE PRESENTS:


WHEREAS, Pearl Louise Pohl of Milwaukee, Wisconsin was a dedicated elementary school teacher for 45 years; and,


