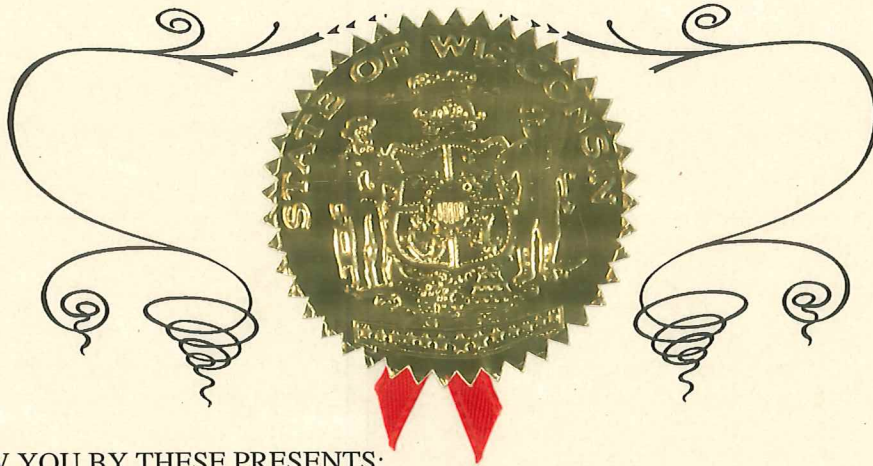


CITATION OF COMMENDATION

WHEREAS, Dr. Laurence Jahn was born on June 24, 1926, in Jefferson, Wisconsin; and




