She served as clerk of the Poynette Public School Board for 14 years, secretary of Columbia County Teacher's College and Columbia County Nursing Home, was a supervisor of the Columbia County Board fro 14 years and Columbia County Board Chairman from 1988 to 1990, on the State Waste Facility Board and the State Forest Productivity Board, treasurer and Sunday school superintendent, officer in Women's Organ ization and Youth Activities of the Presbyterian Church, direc-tor of the Poynette Pioneer Places for 16 years, president of the Poynette Wenney's Club and the Poynette Women's Club and state president of the Federation of Women's Clubs from 1970 to 1972, served 12 years on the board of directors of the National Federation of Women's Clubs, was a charter member president in 1978 and the direcpresident in 1978 and the director of the Friendship of Mac-Kenzie Environmental Education Center for 15 years. She was given the GFWC-WI Woman of Achievement in 2000 and inducted into the Wiscon-sin Conservation Hall of Fame in 2003. Her greatest joy was in her family. daughter, Jean; in 2003.
