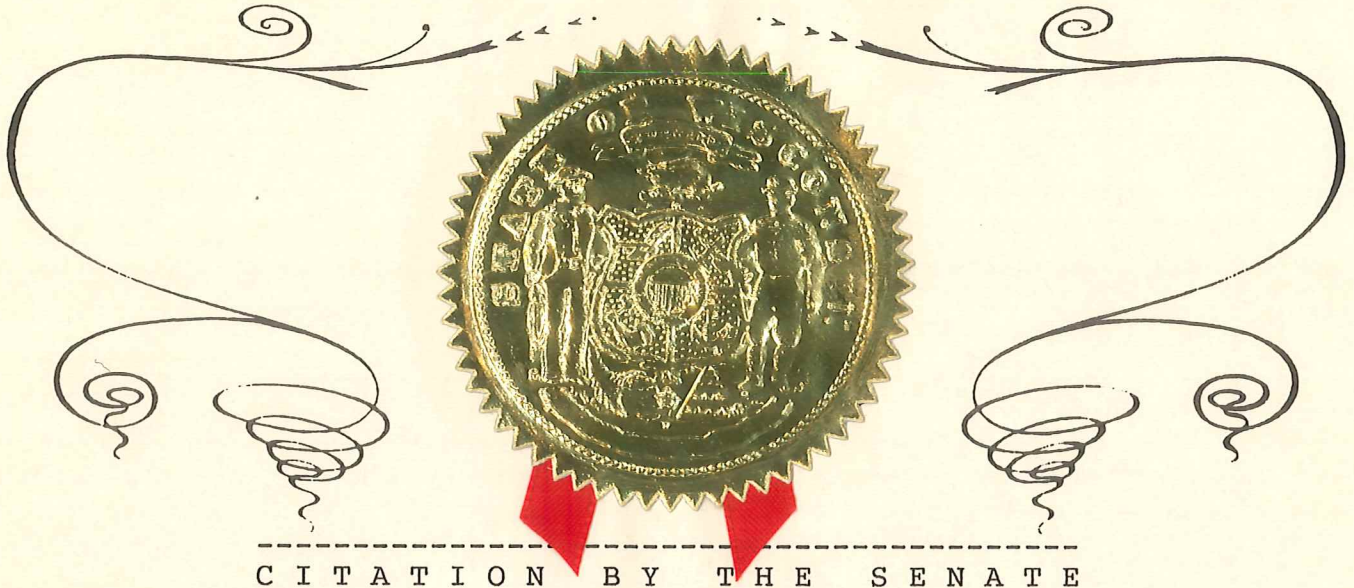

KNOW YOU BY THESE PRESENTS:


WHEREAS, Melvin N. "Mully" Taylor was born in 1903 in Merrill, Wisconsin, and after growing up and working across America, returned to Wisconsin to begin a long career promoting Wisconsin's forests; and

WHEREAS, Taylor, recognizing the need to practice forestry, created Trees for Tomorrow, Inc. and served as its executive director for 31 years; and

WHEREAS, under Taylor's guidance and direction, Trees for Tomorrow has grown to become a leader in environmental education, providing all citizens the opportunity to learn more about the value of our woodlands; and


WHEREAS, Taylor's contributions have been recognized by many. In 1966 he was named Wisconsin Conservation Educator of the Year and received the Distinguished Service Award from the Forest History Association of Wisconsin in 1983; now
