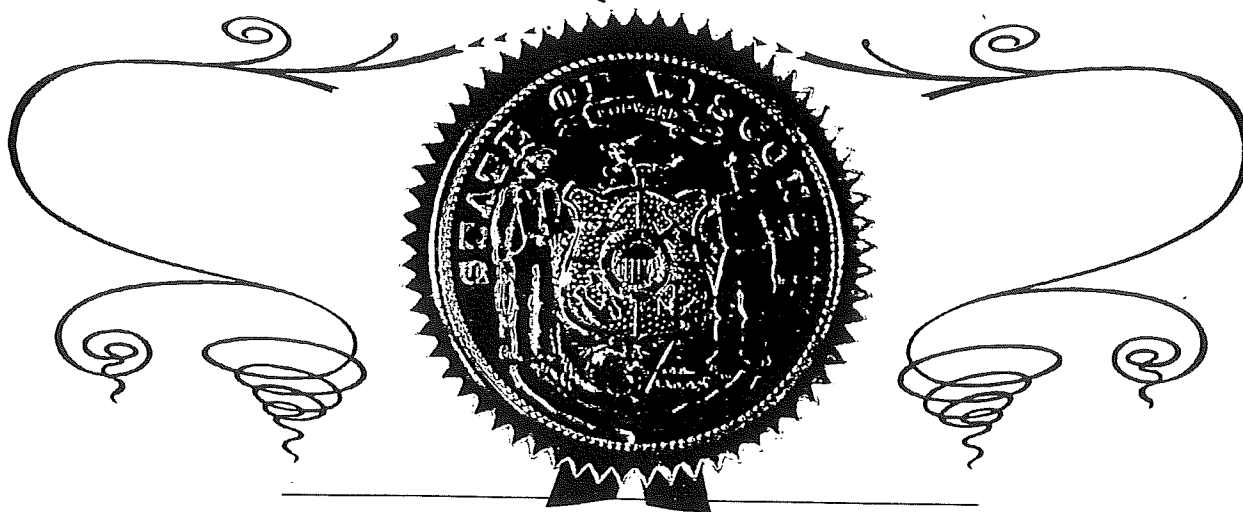


# State of Wisconsin

*WHEREAS, Jacob H. "Jake" Beuscher was a true conservationist who used the legislative process to affect change throughout his career; and*

*WHEREAS, Jake was a key member of the University of Wisconsin Law School faculty where he pioneered the field of environmental law – he created and taught numerous courses that combined the study of legal principles with the issues of land and water protection; and*

*WHEREAS, through his work with the Wisconsin Legislative Council, the Natural Resources Committee State Agencies, the Department of Resource Development and the state Soil and Water Conservation Committee, Jake wrote, reviewed and proposed legislation and he played a vital role in the law creating a state Public Intervenor; and*

*WHEREAS, due to the level of respect held for Jake's opinions and input, he was a member of many governmental committees including the Wisconsin Legislative Council's Water Resources Committee and the Urban Problems Committee, the Governor's Advisory Committee on State Resource Planning and the Governor's Committee on Wisconsin Water Resources; and*

*WHEREAS, Jake devoted his life to teaching people how to be effective conservation leaders – by working to solve problems through the legal and political avenues available to them; now*
