*WHEREAS, E.M. Dahlberg, a devoted educator and conservationist, will be inducted into the Wisconsin Conservation Hall of Fame; and*

*WHEREAS, as a nurseryman and arborist, E.M. Dahlberg encouraged the development of the Ladysmith High School Forest, one of the first school forests in Wisconsin; and*


*WHEREAS, in 1931, he ardently urged for the creation of the Flambeau River State Forest, today a land mass stretching across 90,000 acres; and*


*WHEREAS, as an accomplished author, Dahlberg inspired demand for literature on conservation education in Wisconsin with his beautifully crafted collection of memoirs and his conservation textbook, "Conservation of Renewable Resources;" and*

*WHEREAS, through his textbook, he offered an exceptional guide to the conservation of all resources, arguing for recycling programs, zoning for conservation purposes, and the preservation of scenic vistas; and*


