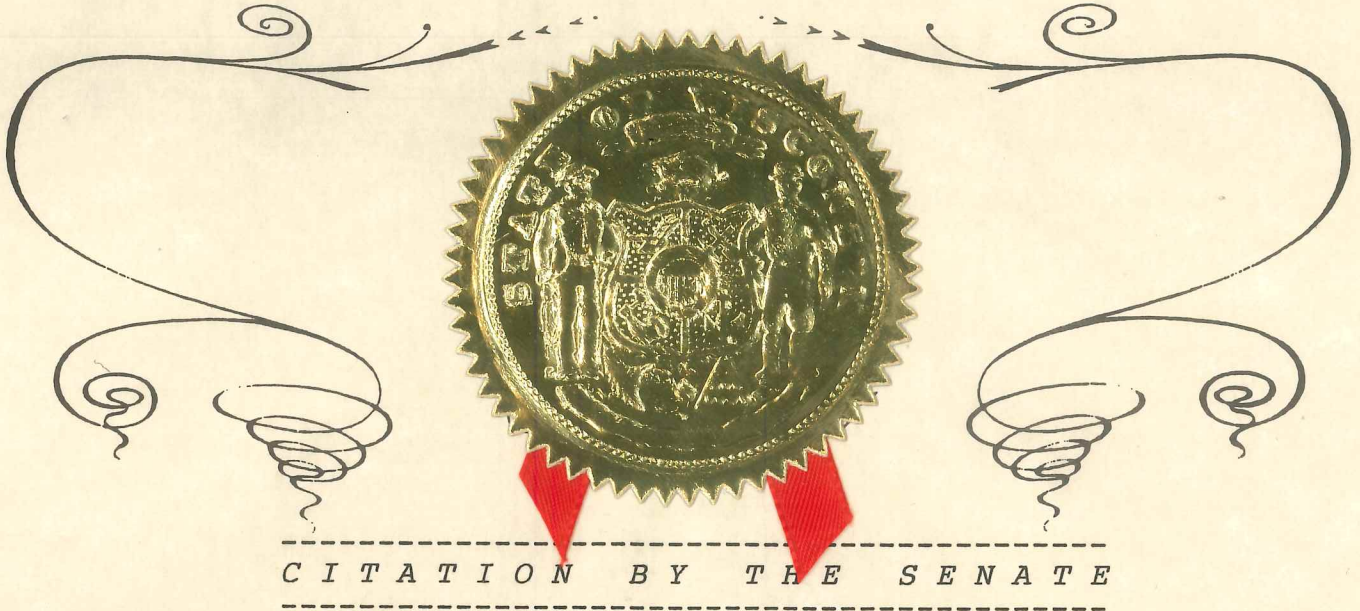


THE STATE OF WISCONSIN


