KNOW YOU BY THESE PRESENTS:


WHEREAS, Wilhelmine D. LaBudde devoted her time and skills to Wisconsin conservation from 1930 to 1955; and

WHEREAS, she was an activist in leading movements for passing legislation for environmental education in our schools in the 1930's and getting school forests established; and


