Conference for Christ from 1966-1984. He was instrumental in the development of many civic, business and service organizations. Mr. Bu-bolz is survived by his wife, Amelia T.M. (Juve) Bubolz, with whom he would have celebrated their 55th wedding anniversary on November 28, 1990; a daughter and son-in-law: Amelia and Walter Rugland, Jr., Granby, Connecticut; three sons and daughters in laws G.
