2:00 p.m.

<u>Gordon Bubolz</u> (1905–1990)

Gordon was a man of contrasts. He was a mix of a conservative business leader and state senator (1945–1953) who was also a dedicated conservationist and volunteer who raised funds for the preservation of lands for public education and enjoyment. He is probably best known for the results of his volunteer efforts to identify and preserve natural areas of ecological significance and educating the public on the value of conservation.





4:00 p.m.

Arlen Christenson (1934 -) Arlen is a visionary whose contributions innovated new and more effective legal protections for our natural resources and helped the public stay engaged in democratic processes. He played a key role in shaping the Public Intervenor's Office during its most formative and effective years. Professor Christenson inspired and mentored countless law students through his classroom teaching and supervision of their clinical work with the Public Intervenor's Office and Midwest Environmental Advocates.

6:00 p.m.

Kathleen Falk (1951 -)

Kathleen has lived her life tirelessly advocating for conservation, the environment, and the underserved by bringing people together to change the world for the better. She developed the tools to be impactful by earning her law degree when women attorneys were few; engaged in the legal system and the three branches of government at the local, state and federal level to create a wide range of legislation and policy; and committed to mentoring the next generation of environmental advocates.
