KNOW YOU BY THESE PRESENTS:


WHEREAS, Wallace Byron Grange was a dedicated author, naturalist and historian for over sixty years; and

WHEREAS, Wallace Grange demonstrated his obvious ability in conservation by becoming Wisconsin's first superintendent of game at the age of 22, one of numerous conservation jobs he held during his lifetime; and

WHEREAS, Wallace Grange demonstrated his dedication to conservation and game management in establishing the Sandhill Game Farm in southwest Wood County, continually expanding and upgrading this wildlife refuge; and

WHEREAS, in 1962 the 9,150 acres known as the Sandhill Game Farm was purchased by the State of Wisconsin and is now known as the Sandhill Wildlife Demonstration Area. This land is now preserved for the future and in the memory of Wallace Grange; now
